

The doctor perspective on communication challenges: A seminar on current tendencies

Friday 29 April 2022, 12.30-15.30

In contemporary doctor-patient communication research, often the patient perspective is prioritized. There are many good reasons for this, but in this seminar, we want to explore the doctor perspective on communication challenges – with special focus on the junior doctor. Taking the doctor perspective will enable us to discuss answers to questions such as: When do (junior) doctors feel challenged? How do they talk about being challenged? How do they navigate these challenges?

In order to get perspectives from research as well as the clinical workplace, we have invited communication researchers as well as clinicians. New findings from qualitative studies of junior doctors' perspectives on challenging communication are presented followed by perspectives from clinicians who work with communication and education in the clinical setting.

In this way, the seminar provides an occasion for informing stakeholders in the clinical setting of results from recent communication research and for future research to be informed by current clinical challenges.
